# CALL FOR SOUTHEAST ASIAN PRODUCERS AND BROADCASTERS

Implementing coproduction meetings for the last 5 years all around the World in the field of creative documentary, Docmonde has an extensive experience of professional encounters, which is now developed in Southeast Asia for the second year.

In March 2015, 10 documentary projects hold by authors from Southeast Asia were presented to seven producers and one TV channel from Europe. **All projects found opportunities for international coproductions.** 

In March 2016, the second edition of the Asiadoc coproduction meetings will again take place at the Bophana Centre in Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Twelve projects will be presented to more producers and broadcasters from Europe and Southeast Asia.

For producers and broadcasters from Southeast Asia, participating in the Asiadoc coproduction meetings is a great opportunity to find well-developed documentary projects from young and promising directors; to get connected with producers and broadcasters from the region and from Europe; to build international coproductions in a very professional context.

We are now looking forproducers and broadcasters from Southeast Asiainterested in taking part in the Asiadoc 2016 coproduction meetings.

### A. Concept

Prior to the coproduction meetings, the 12 selected authors will have benefited from a two weeks scriptwriting residence led by Award winning filmmakers. Last October, 6 Vietnamese authors were accompanied by Jacques Deschamps who helped them to develop their stories. In February 2016, Arne Birkenstock, twice winner of the Lola price for best documentary in Germany, will lead a residence for 6 authors from other countries in Southeast Asia.

During these development workshops, authors can carry out a deep diagnostic and detailed critical analysis of their projects, carry out exercises in rough video sketches, and finally write an actual documentary script for their projects, with synopsis and note of intention.

From March 6 to 9, those 12 authors will pitch their projects to a panel of producers and broadcasters from Europe and Southeast Asia. First during plenary sessions and then in small discussion groups, documentary professionals will exchange on the projects. At the end of the two days exchanges, we hope that coproduction teams will be created **building bridges between countries and continents.**
